Since 2001 annual auditions single out 9-12 talented young musicians from all parts of Europe to partake in the *colluvio* Chamber Music Academy. After completing the Master Courses at Gut Hornegg, Steiermark, Austria, there follows an international concert tour which also takes the musicians to their home country.

"Together in Europe" and polishing prerequisites in Chamber Music performance

The speciality of meeting participants from differing cultural backgrounds. – The young musicians get to know each other first at Gut Hornegg, have never played together before and are able after 10 days to bring the most challenging chamber music works to a high standard of performance.
